Goals of National 9-1-1 Program

- Facilitate coordination among public and private stakeholders at local, State and Federal/national levels
 - Serve as an information clearinghouse
 - Administer grant program for the benefit of PSAPs
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- Provide a Federal focus for 9-1-1
 - Promote and support 9-1-1 services



Jobs Act, Section 6413: Public Safety Trust Fund

1. Repayment of amount borrowed for First Responder Network Authority (\$2B)
2. State and Local Implementation Fund (\$135M)
3. Buildout of First Responder Network Authority (\$7B)
4. Public Safety Research (\$100M)
5. Deficit Reduction (\$20.4B)
- 6. *911 Grants (\$115M)***
7. Additional Public Safety Research (\$200M)

911 Grant Program: Eligible Use of Funds

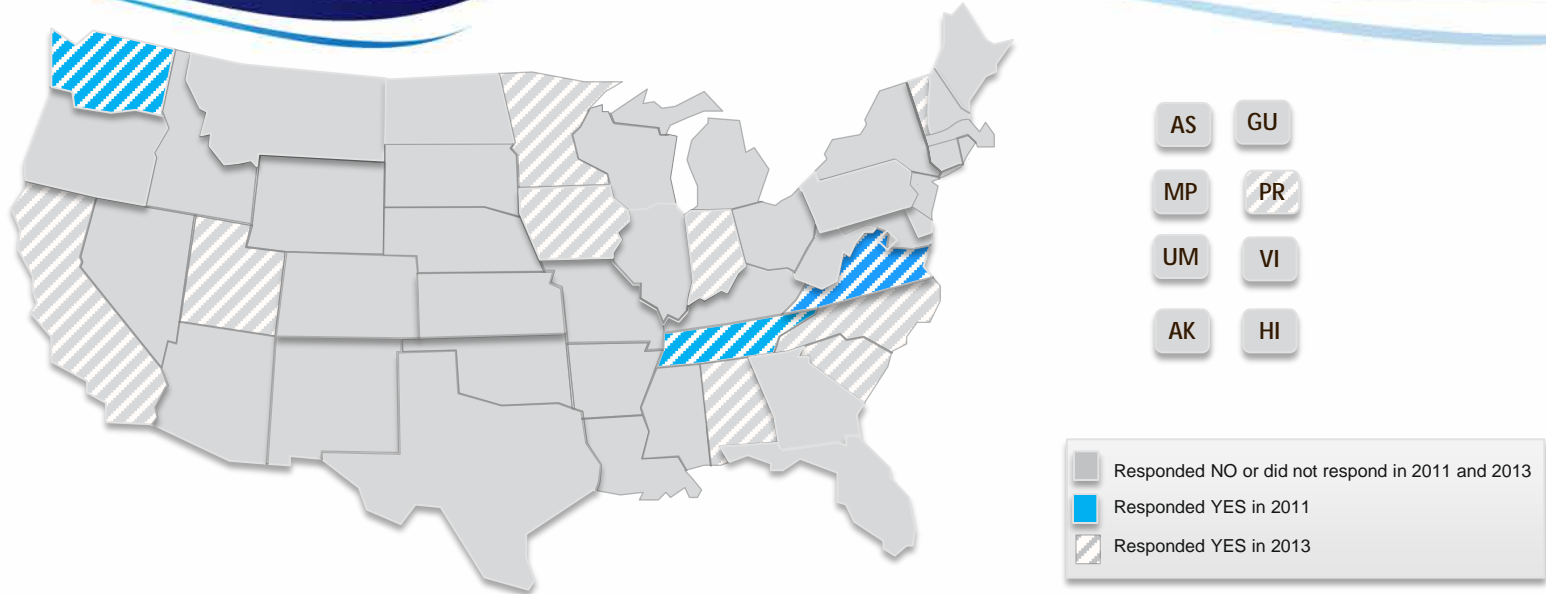
- Implementation and operation of 911 services, E911 services, migration to an IP-enabled emergency network, adoption/operation of NG911 services & applications
- Implementation of IP-enabled emergency services and applications enabled by NG911 including establishment of IP backbone and application layer software
- Training public safety personnel including call takers

911 Grant Program: other requirements

- 60/40 match
- Certification that 911 funds have not been diverted
- Coordination
 - Designation of a single officer/government body
 - PSAPs
 - Coordination/Implementation Plan
 - *Has integrated services involved in the implementation/delivery of 911 services*

Timeline

- Auction
- Public Safety Trust Fund
- Transfer of \$\$ to National 911 Office
 - Regulations
 - Oversight infrastructure

NG911: Lessons Learned

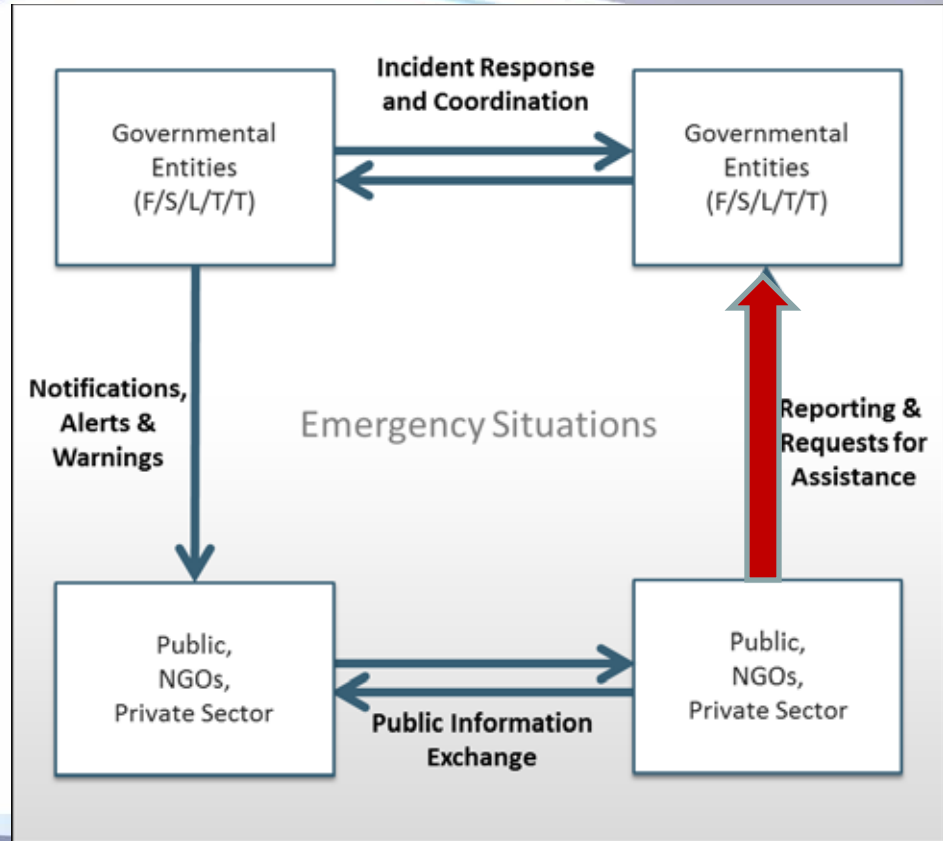
- Lateral collaboration – moving from 6,000 independent PSAP operations to one, interconnected system of 6,000 PSAPs
- Vertical Collaboration – receiving new forms of digital data/info from the public – transferring digital data/info to emergency responders

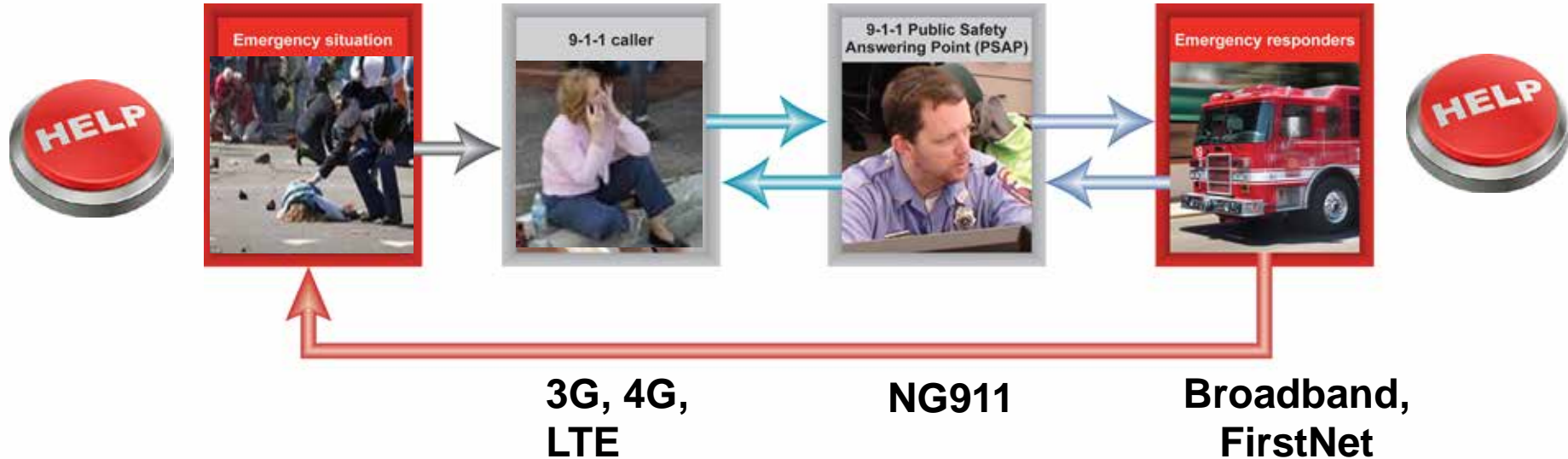
